Spring Validation Programs

<u>Heifers</u> - Anyone planning to show a heifer in the Spring 2020 major shows need to validate their animal(s) only once in their show career, unless they change ownership or breed. Validation for heifers will be held on TUESDAY, OCTOBER 22nd from 5-6 pm at <u>Colorado Valley Vet Clinic</u> in Columbus. Exhibitors must provide a color copy of the heifer's registration papers. Heifers will not be validated if a color copy of registration papers are not presented. Exhibitors may turn in a color copy of heifer registration papers to the Extension Office prior to the validation event. Heifers MUST have appropriate identification tattoo and/ or brand that matches registration papers at the time of validation. There will be an \$18 fee for each heifer validated to be paid at time of validation. Please notify the Extension Office prior to October 1st if you wish to validate so we can anticipate how many to expect. Anyone who purchased lamb tags will also validate their lambs at this rime

The 2019 Colorado County Fair is set for Wednesday, September 4th through Saturday, September 7th. Judging of Home Economics entries will be held Wednesday and livestock entries will be checked in on Wednesday by 6:00 p.m.

Fair Livestock Shows will begin on Thursday morning with hogs, lambs and goats in the show ring. Friday contests include broilers, rabbits, pen of three, commercial heifers, market steers, scramble heifers and junior beef heifer shows along with showmanship at the Colorado County Fair livestock arena. There will also be Breeding lamb and Prospect sheep shows as well as Breeding and Prospect Goat shows on Friday. The livestock judging contest will be held Saturday morning at 8:00 a.m. followed by the Junior sale at 1:00 p.m.

The livestock area clean-up will begin on Sunday at 8:00 a.m. and continue to all areas are cleaned up and all Sale animals are checked out.
