Photography & Scholarships

The 2020 Texas 4-H Photography Contest rules and guidelines have been released. The theme for this year is "The Elements". This category must contain one of the 4 elements: earth, air, water, or fire. Photos can include a combination of one or more elements, but the element(s) itself must be the focal point of the photo. Examples: dust devil. river, steam, snow, campfire, water droplets, clouds, etc. Photo resolution must be a minimum of 300 dpi quality resolution. Must be 3:2 (4"x6") or 5:4 (8"x10") ratio (either landscape or portrait). Photo may not be larger than 5120 KB (5MB). This contest is for 4-H members in the 9th—12th grades and the entry deadline for the county contest is **February 7th.** The state deadline is March 1st, 2020. Entries are \$10.00 each. and the rules and guidelines can be found online https://d114-h.tamu.edu/files/2019/12/19-20_Photography-Rules-and-Guidelines.pdf . The categories include: Animals-Domestic, Animals-Wildlife, Catch-All, Details & Macro, Dominant Color, Elements of Design, Enhanced, Food, Landscape & Nature, Motion/Action, Night, People, Plant/Flora, Sports, Shadow/ Silhouette. Theme—Promote 4-H, Travel & Place. The District 11 guidelines and categories will be the same as the state rules and guidelines. The deadline to submit entries for the county contest is February 7th, 2020. Those 4-H'ers that advance to the District contest (3rd through 8th graders) will need to submit their entries on 4-H Connect by March 1, 2020. The fee will be \$10 per individual not per entry. County Council Scholarships

The 4-H Council sponsors two \$250 scholarships to graduating seniors that have been enrolled in 4-H for at least three years, including the current year. Applications will be emailed to seniors currently enrolled and will also be available at the Extension Office. The deadline for submitting applications is March 27, 2020. Scholarship recipients will have scholarships presented at their school recognition event and will be recognized at the 4-H Awards Banquet.

2020 Texas 4-H Scholarship

The 2020 Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship Program opened Friday, November 1st. Applicants will no longer submit their application through 4-H CONNECT or by paper/mail. Applicants must have their application reviewed by their CEA and have their CEA complete the CEA Verification Form. The applicant will need to upload this form with their application. The form is available to print from the Foundation website under the "Apply" button on the Scholarship page or from within their application. Applicants now have the option to upload a pdf document for responses that are better suited in a table format. There have been no changes to the criteria required of the applicant, only the way the applicant applies. Here is the 2020 scholarship timeline: **Application Deadline: February 14th**

Spring Spectacular May 2-3, 2020

The 2020 D11 4-H Spring Spectacular information is now posted on the D11 website: https://d114-h.tamu.edu/district-11-4-h-spring-spectacular. Please refer to the website for up-to-date information. Spring Spectacular includes Roundup events, including Educational presentations, Share-the-Fun categories, as well as Consumer Decision Making, Fashion Show and Food Show/Food Challenge, Leaders-4-Life, and Beef, Horse and Nutrition Ouiz Bowls.

- 4-H Connect registration deadline is April 3 and late registration is from April 4-17.
- Some things to note: There is an overall \$15 management fee which will include a t-shirt or souvenir. Each contest has a \$5 fee.
- The event will be held at Victoria College Emerging Technology Complex 7403
 Lone Tree Road, Victoria, TX
- Share-the-Fun, Educational Presentations, Public Speaking and Consumer Decision Making will be held on Saturday, May 2.
- Share-the-Fun is an event related to the Theater and Performing Arts Project and includes: <u>Celebrate 4-H, Choreographed Routines, Dramedy, Musical/Instrumental, Poetry/Prose, Solo/Band Performance, and Vocal.</u> All categories have 6 minutes to present their act and 4 minutes to set up and take down (a total of 10 minutes)
- A 4-H Educational Presentation includes what you have learned in a project area. It can be done as a individual or a team of two. The Educational Presentation can be accomplished by using props, posters or media presentations, or it can be you just speaking and convincing or educating with words alone. This contest allows you 12 minutes to complete you presentation with a 9 minute time to set up and take down any props, etc. Following is a list of topics for educational presentations

2020 4-H Outdoor Challenge— is a contest consisting of 10 activities set up for teams of two to compete within their age division. The activities could cover basic skills and knowledge in outdoor safety, outdoor skills, swimming, paddling, shooting, wildlife and habitat, biologist skills, fishing, first aid, outdoor gear, consumer education, off road bicycling, and climbing. The Outdoor Challenge contest is scheduled for June 21-23, 2020 at the Texas 4-H Center, Lake Brownwood. 4-H members of all ages are eligible to prepare and participate. Participants will compete in a team of two within 4-H age divisions. All participants must have training and experience in all activities posted for the currents year's event. Team members must be from the same county 4-H program. Registration will be held on 4-H Connect April 15-May 15, 2020; Participation is limited to the first 50 full teams that register. Registration fee is \$50 per contestant. Optional Lodging and Meals at the 4-H Center are available by reserving on https://texas4hcenter.tamu.edu/ during the same time frame as contest registration.
