Record books and County Elections

It is time to begin preparing to complete a 4-H Record Book. Record book forms may be downloaded from the Texas 4-H website at http://texas4-h.tamu.edu/recordbooks. There will be a record book training provided by the District office. When that is release Agent will share via 4-H Online. 4-H members planning to submit a record book are reminded that the books must be turned in to the Extension Office no later than June 4, 2021. NO LATE RECORD-BOOKS WILL BE ALLOWED TO SUBMIT FOR JUDGING. Members should note that a record book must be submitted in order to apply for the Bronze, Silver or Gold Star awards. Record book registration will end June 25th 11:59pm.

Officer elections will be held on May 17th at the Extension Office. The meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. The guidelines for Council officers say that a member must have represented their club on council for at least one year. Any qualified youth wishing to run for any or all Council offices will need to fill out an Officer Application and turn it in to the Extension Office by May 10th. COUNCIL OFFICER Applications will NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER FRIDAY, May 14TH. Applications can be emailed to individuals upon request or may be picked up from the Extension office. Applications have been sent via 4-H online as well. Offices will be voted on individually by secret ballot beginning with the Chairman. Members may only serve two (2) terms in any office. Please see the attached information for more details about Council Officer positions, what is expected, and what responsibilities each officer is required to obtain.

State 4-H Roundup

State 4-H Roundup—will be held June 7-10, 2021 at Texas A&M University in College Station. There are a number of Invitational contests open to 4-H youth in the 6th through 12th grades. The registration period for Roundup is May 1st through May 15th. Youth may enter only one (1) contest per day.

Invitational contests and workshops must be signed-up for during the May 1st-15th registration period. You had to compete in both county and district roundup contest to be eligible for the State 4-H Roundup.

2021 Leadership Labs

District 11 Leadership Lab—Senior members

<u>District 11 4-H Leadership Lab will be held June 15-18,</u> 2021 at McKinney Roughs Nature Park in Cedar Creek, Texas. Leadership Lab is a three-day/two-night leadership training for 4-H youth. The theme for Leadership Lab 2021 is "Bringing the World Together Through 4-H" Lab activities will be coordinated around this theme. The cost for lab is \$200 for 4-H members and \$165 for adult leaders. The 4-H County Council will refund a portion (up to \$100 per person) when you return from Lab.

All participants and chaperones **must** register on 4-H Connect between Monday, April 19 and Friday, May 28. Leadership Lab is restricted to youth ages 13 through 17 as of June 1, 2021. Graduated seniors will be allowed to attend. Chaperones must be enrolled as volunteers on 4-H Connect. When you register on 4-H Connect, please check that your Health Form and Waiver and Indemnification Agreement and Medical Treatment form is completed. You will also need to fill out the McKinney Roughs liability form.

Dress for Leadership Lab is casual, but neat. Conventional shoes or sandals must be worn at all times. A 'Sunday' outfit is needed for the banquet. Complete Leadership Lab information is posted on http://d114-h.tamu.edu/events-and-contests/leadership-lab/.

The 2021 Jr. Lab workshops include Fishing, Kayaking, Walking through the Wetlands, Science on the Sphere Tour and Team Building.
