The goal of the Texas 4-H Food Show is to provide an opportunity for 4-H contestants to highlight their culinary skills while also improving their presentation and interview skills. More than 120,000 youth participate in the 4-H Food & Nutrition Project where they learn to prepare nutritious and safe meals and adopt behaviors that can help reduce their risk for chronic disease.

- ⇒ Develop healthy eating habits to reduce the risk of chronic disease.
- \Rightarrow Develop food preparation, safety, and nutrition skills.
- \Rightarrow Provide leadership and public speaking opportunities.
- ⇒ Provide opportunities for participants to connect MyPlate and Dietary Guidelines to their daily lives.
- ⇒ Learn about nutrients and the health benefits they provide to your body.

More than 100,000 youth participate in the 4-H Food & Nutrition Project, learning how to prepare nutritious and safe meals and snacks and adopt behaviors that can help reduce their risk for chronic disease. This contest challenges teams of 4-H members to create a dish using only a predetermined set of ingredients. From these ingredients, team members must identify and prepare the dish, then make a presentation about it to the judges.

OBJECTIVES

*Provide opportunities for participants to exhibit their knowledge and skill when preparing and presenting a dish

- *Provide opportunities for participants to learn from other team members
- \Rightarrow Promote teamwork
- ⇒ Give participants opportunities for public speaking
- \Rightarrow Provide leadership opportunities

Age. Age divisions are determined by a participant's age/grade as of August 31 of the current 4-H year. See the Texas 4-H Rules and Guidelines for

specific age requirements. Senior Division: Grades 9-12 **Teams per district.** Each district may advance four teams to compete in the state contest (the first-place team in each category at the district contest). Teams advancing to state will not automatically be assigned to the same category as they were at district. **Members per team.** Each team will have at least three and a maximum of four members. Teams may not include members in different age divisions.

2021 4-H Annual Fundraiser

The annual Colorado County 4-H Council fundraiser is approaching fast. Information and order forms will be provided to all club managers by October.

The fruit and nut orders will be due by November 5th and should be delivered by December 10th. (Subject to change) All 4-H members are encouraged to participate in this county wide fundraiser. Proceeds from this fundraiser are used to fund all council sponsored activities

including community service projects, scholarships, day camps, contest awards, postage and supplies for the 4-H newsletter, and the annual awards program.

Participating in the fundraiser also qualifies you to submit a activity reimbursement form at the end of the 4-H year. Funds also pay part of the expenses for leadership labs, State Roundup and 4-H Congress.



Colorado County 4-H Activity Reimbursement Request Form

The purpose of this form is to offer reimbursement for active 4-H members in Colorado County 4-H for 4-H events. Reimbursement is available for event/activity enrollment through 4-H connect, Texas 4-H Center and other approved 4-H registrations. Reimbursement is available for District, State, and National events. 4-H member must have sold two hundred dollars in 4-H County Fundraiser, participated in a community service opportunity, attended at least two 4-H Council meetings and two Club meetings AND attended the Annual 4-H Banquet. 4-H reimbursement request form must be turned into Extension Office (postmarked) on or before August 1st of the current 4-H year in order to receive a reimbursement. Reimbursements are based on the Colorado County 4-H Budget funds available. Please only fill out 1 form per 4-H member. No reimbursements will be given if form is not filled out and returned by August 1.

- 4-H Connect registration event does not include any livestock or companion animal validation. I.E. horse validations and dog validations are not eligible for reimbursement. Additionally, major livestock show validations (steers, heifers, lambs, goat, swine) are not eligible for reimbursement.
- Tag-in and entry fees associated with the Colorado County Fair are not eligible for reimbursement.
- Major livestock show entries for activities held at the following major shows are not eligible for reimbursement: Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo, San Angelo Stock Show and Rodeo, San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo, Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, Rio Grande Valley Livestock Show, Rodeo Austin, Heart of Texas Fair and Rodeo, and the State Fair of Texas.
- All recipes must be attached to Activity Reimbursement Request Form

Guidelines:

4-H member must have sold \$200 in 4-H County Fundraiser, participated in a community service opportunity, attended at least two 4-H Council meetings and two Club meetings AND attended the Annual 4-H Banquet.

**4-H reimbursement request form must be turned into Extension Office (postmarked) on or before August 1st of the current 4-H year in order to receive a reimbursement. **

- ** Reimbursements are based on the Colorado County 4-H Budget. **
- ** Please only fill out 1 form per 4-H member.**
- ** No reimbursements will be given if form is not filled out and returned by August 1. **
