Photography & Scholarships

The 2022 Texas 4-H Photography Contest rules and guidelines have been released. The 2021-2022 theme is "My Hometown". Show what is special, iconic, unique, or even quirky about your hometown. Capture what makes it exceptional, historic, fun, or simply the best place to grow up. Photos must be uploaded to 4-H Online in their appropriate category at time of entry. • Size: Must be 3:2 (4"x6") or 5:4 (8"x10") ratio (either landscape or portrait). • Size: Photo must be a minimum of 1MB and a maximum of 10MB. • Tips: Upload the highest resolution possible. Review your photo at 100% size before uploading This contest is for 4-H members • Junior participants must be in the 3rd through 5th grade as of August 31, 2021. • Intermediate participants must be in 6th through 8th grade as of August 31, 2021. • Senior 4-H members 9th—12th grades and the entry deadline for the county contest is February 4th. The district deadline is February **18, 2022.** Entries are \$5.00 each. and the rules and guidelines can be found online at https://d114-h.tamu.edu/files/2021/12/21-22 Rules -and-Guidelines-1.pdf

The categories include: Animals-Domestic, Animals-Wildlife, Catch-All, Details & Macro, Dominant Color, Elements of Design, Enhanced, Food, Landscape & Nature, Motion/Action, People, Plant/Flora, Sports, Theme—My Hometown, Travel & Place. The District 11 guidelines and categories will be the same as the state rules and guidelines. The deadline to submit entries for the county contest is February 4, 2022. Those 4-H'ers that advance to the District contest (3rd through 8th graders) will need to submit their entries on 4-H Connect by February 18, 2022. Applications will be emailed to seniors currently enrolled and will also be available at the Extension Office. The deadline for submitting applications is April 1st, 2022.

2022 Record book Workshop

Why is it important you keep a record of your 4-H activities? Because, by recording your activities you can remember all the fun you've had so far, and set future goals! Keeping records of 4-H projects could help you when you apply for college scholarships too! 4-H Record books are books you make to record your annual projects. **February 7th** there will be a record book workshop provided via teams for those who are interested in starting a record book or entering a record book in the County, District, and State contest for the 2022 year.

There will also be a link sent out via 4-H online providing the link to join. This workshop session will also be recorded for those of you who are unavailable to join.

District 11 Spring Spectacular Contest

- Educational Presentations (individual or team of 2 members.—Method demonstrations or illustrated talks.)
- Fashion Show (The Fashion Show has two divisions: buying and construction.)
- Share-The-Fun Contest (Solo/Band Performance, Musical Instrumental, Poetry/Prose, Vocal)

Age division

- Senior Division Contestants must be in 9th 12th grade for the 2021 2022 4-H year.
- Intermediate Division Contestants must be in 6th 8th grade for the 2021 2022 4-H year.
- Junior Division Contestants must be in 3rd 5th grade for the 2021 2022 4-H year.
