Hypoxylon Canker of Post Oak Trees

I've started to get a few calls about declining oak trees. Most of these trees are post oak trees that are experiencing oak decline and some are showing signs of hypoxylon canker. This canker is a fungus that causes cankers and

death of oaks and other hardwood trees. This fungus typically attacks trees that are weakened, stressed or damaged. We usually see this in post oak trees after periods of drought. Symptoms of hypoxylon canker include: yellow/brown leaves, small leaves and reduced twig growth, dead limbs and branches, water sprouts growing on the trunks, dieback of feeder roots, white and stringy sapwood in the cankered area. Once the fungus sets in there isn't a whole lot that can be done to save the tree. Preventing stress to the tree is key. Vertical mulching is one way to improve the soil environment. Our plant pathologists have a great factsheet on hy-
