Summer is a busy time of year for county extension agents. When July arrives we as agents prepare for our annual professional development conferences. The Texas County Agricultural Agent Association (TCAAA) Annual Professional Development Conference took me to Wichita Falls the week of July 9th. The highlight of this trip was getting to go on a professional development tour to the RA Brown Ranch in Throckmorton. While at the ranch Donnell Brown gave us Ag agents a very informational view of their operation and outlook on being cattlemen and cattlewomen. One of the neat things I got to see while on this tour was their in-pen weigh system. This was a new technology that I was not familiar with. The technology allows for cattle to weigh themselves as they go to the water trough each day. The weigh plate is positioned so only their front feet can step on it, to eliminate any other animals stepping on the plate and skewing the reading. As the cattle put their heads to the trough, an RFID reader collects their tag number and partial weight. Then an algorithm uses a formula to calculate the animals total weight and records it in the computer system. This technology allows ranch-

ers a low stress option for gathering daily weights on

cattle.

I'm not here to endorse this technology or encourage every cattle producer in Colorado County to go out an purchase this equipment to start using on your own ranch. I just wanted to share a neat piece of technology that is being utilized in the beef industry! If you're interested in learning more about this technology,


